

# ECONOMICS MAJOR, ASSET MANAGEMENT CONCENTRATION (B.A.) (COMBINED B.A./M.B.A. BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION)

A Combined Degree program enables undergraduate students to enroll in graduate courses in their senior year, which can be counted towards the completion of both their Bachelor's and Master's degree requirements.

The ability to take these "swing courses" allows students to earn both their Bachelor's and Master's degrees in a shortened period of time, typically within five years of intensive study. ## Graduate Swing Courses

A combined degree program allows students to complete 6-12 credits ("graduate swing courses") while enrolled as an undergraduate. These courses count for both the Bachelors and Masters degrees. Graduate Swing Courses count as free electives in the undergraduate program and as required or elective courses in the graduate program.
