HOSPITALITY, SPORTS, EVENTS, AND TOURISM (B.A.) (COMBINED B.A./M.B.A. BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION)

The Hospitality, Sports, Events and Tourism (HSET) sectors are highly diverse yet intensely interconnected industries that are growing very fast. A combined HSET/MBA degree enhances students' HSET sector management skills and gives them an opportunity to earn a highly visible professional degree in a shorter period of time.

The "4 + 1" Bachelor's/MBA is a five-year program, during which students will spend three years taking courses required for their chosen bachelor's degree program and in their fourth year, they will complete (along with required undergraduate program courses) 6 credits worth of graduate business (MBA) coursework. This will satisfy both undergraduate degree requirements and count toward achievement of the MBA degree. In the fifth year, students will take graduate courses required for a General MBA, in a full-time format.
