

LATIN WITH TEACHER CERTIFICATION IN LATIN (PRESCHOOL-GRADE 12) (B.A.)

Students who wish to pursue P-12 teacher certification in Latin must apply to and be admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Once admitted, students will be matriculated into the B.A. in Secondary Education (<http://catalog.montclair.edu/programs/secondary-education-p12-ba/>) program as a second major.
